Book Club Summer 2021 - Discovery Elementary

What is a book club?

- It is a way for you to connect with other people and books.
- There are many different ways to have a book club. You can all read the same book or you can read different books.
- You can even just come together to read your own books quietly and then share what you are reading.



Step 1 - Pick A Theme - Decide what type of book club you want?

- Will you read fantasy fiction? Nonfiction? Books that feature diversity?

Step 2 - Pick People

- It can be just two people or a large group. You can meet with friends from school or friends all over the world. You might be brave and ask someone you do not know well.
- It can include people your age, your siblings, your parents or even your grandparents.

Step 3 - Pick a Place

- You can meet virtually or in person. Snacks are always a good idea.
- If you meet in person, it can be helpful if you always meet at the same place.

Step 4 - Pick Dates & a Regular Time

- How often will your club meet? Weekly? Monthly?
- It is a good idea to make it a regular day and time.

Step 5 - Pick a Name

- Something that inspires you. It can be very simple or even a little crazy
- Examples - Readers & Eaters Book Club, Books & Basketball Book Club , Amazing Avid Readers Book Club, Explorers Exploring Books Book Club, Team Awesome....
